Women, Violence, Fundraising...

The media often come under fire from gender activists for not doing enough to address gender inequalities that exist in the newsrooms. These inequalities are evident in the way the media report on women issues, portraying and stereotyping them as victims and as people with no potential to solve their own problems.

In this week's issue of NGO Pulse, we bring you an article by Claudia Forster-Towne from Consultancy Africa Intelligence's Gender Issues Unit, focusing on challenges faced by women media practitioners in Southern Africa.

Forster-Towne is of the view that by dominating the decision-making positions in various media outlets in the region, men control the means of expression and are able to convey the ideas and values of a patriarchal order. She maintains: "Ownership of media houses should reserve spaces for women owners, and these women in turn should work to produce media with a social conscience." Click here to read the full article.

South African taxi drivers need to be taught to accept and treat women as equals. Commuters, taxi associations, government and other relevant stakeholders should also condemn the increasing number of stickers in minibuses which continue to describe women in a manner that is humiliating.

In another article, Tarisai Nyamweda, a media intern at Gender Links, warns that the 'ruthless' behaviour directed toward women by taxi drivers, for how they dress and what they wear, is becoming a norm in our "It is often said rape victims 'asked for it' because they were dressed 'inappropriately'. But rape is a crime, and it's about criminal behaviour that scars a woman emotionally and physically. How dare we make it the woman's fault for simply wearing a certain outfit?"
